

THE NATIONAL WORKSHOP ON CHRISTIAN UNITY AND UMEIT: USA

The National Workshop on Christian Unity (NWCU) is held every year in a different area of the USA. It is an opportunity for ecumenical worship, networking, learning and growing among colleagues of several, various Christian faith communions in the USA.

Parallel to the NWCU several faith communions have “networks” that meet in order for their member to learn about ecumenical and interreligious ministries within their own communion. The United Methodist network is called UMEIT: USA and meets several times during the NWCU.

UMEIT: USA has a three-year rotation for it's focus:



YEAR ONE

Ecumenism 101: This is a training about the basics of the Ecumenical Movement and its history and theology.



YEAR TWO

Ecumenism 201: This is a training about how to dialogue with others at the local level, and how it is done on the denominational level.



YEAR THREE

Ecumenism 301: This is a training about the basics of the Interreligious Movement and its history and theology

The theme of the NWCU will be "Radical Hospitality," and the year in the UMEIT: USA rotation is Ecumenism 201.
